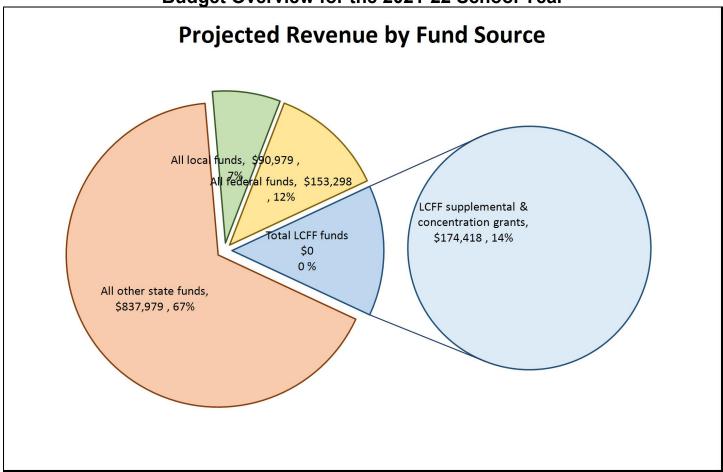

School districts receive funding from different sources: state funds under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), other state funds, local funds, and federal funds. LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).





This chart shows the total general purpose revenue East Nicolaus Joint Union High School expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The total revenue projected for East Nicolaus Joint Union High School is \$4,451,119, of which \$3,368, 863 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), \$837,979 is other state funds, \$90,979 is local funds, and

\$153,298 is federal funds. Of the \$3,368, 863 in LCFF Funds, \$174,418 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

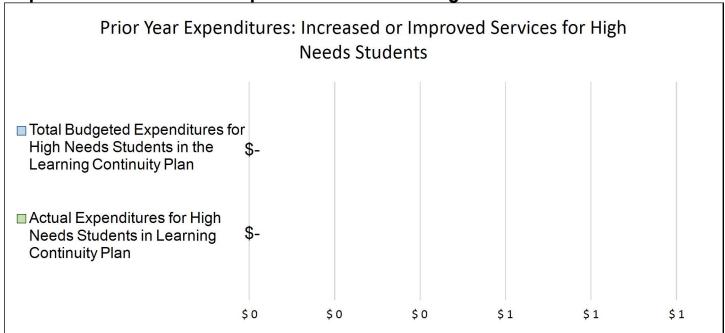
Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in the LCAP for the 2021-22 School Year
